As a King Priest he brings both the righteousness of God and peace with God.

What happens when Abraham meets Melchizedek? v1b-2
Melchizedek is presented to us as a divine like figure. An Eternal King Priest, full of justice and peace, who brings blessing and deserves our honour.

## Resembles the Son of God

When we read about Melchizedek who are we to think about? v3b

Who was David thinking of when he wrote Psalm 110v4:

'The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind; you are a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek.'

Remember: God's intention for all humanity was that we would live as kings and priests. Adam was to be a king representing God to the world and Adam was to be a priest enjoying God's presence. But Adam failed and all humanity with him. We need a better King Priest one like Melchizedek who represents God to the people and people to God.

God not only tells us what a priest should be, God also establishes a priesthood for the people.

The Priest we have

<u>Remember:</u> Jesus is our Forever King Priest who delivers on all his promises. In Jesus everything that we have broken is undone and restored. He makes us 'kings' and 'priests' so that we can live as God intends and enjoy God's presence. 'But you are a chosen people, a **royal priesthood**...Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God.; Once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. (1 Peter 2v9-10)

What does this mean for us? We have un and un access.

#### The Priest who lives

Jesus is our Permanent Priest. That means He saves completely! Two things are implied by the word 'completely'.

#### Jesus saves eternally

An intercessor is someone who stands in for you and represents you. Here Jesus as the perfect one represents us as perfect to the Father. He speaks to the Father on our behalf.

What does Jesus speak to the Father for us?

What might Jesus ask from the Father for us?

Remember: Jesus is interceding for us, every moment of every day of every month and of every year. He never stops or sleeps; He never forgets or gets fed up. He is never disillusioned or disappointed with us. He will keep speaking to the Father and asking the Father until we are with him. He is a forever priest so at no point in our life we fall from him. He saves us eternally.

### Jesus saves us sufficiently

Unrighteous people represented by unrighteous priests before a righteous God is going to fail every time. But in Jesus we have a righteous priest, perfect, without sin, Representing us before a righteous God. That m\_\_\_\_\_ o\_\_\_\_ n\_\_\_\_ completely and sufficiently v26.

How does Jesus meet our need? v27

Remember: Jesus perfectly meets our need, he takes our place and dies our death. His work on the cross is sufficient it is once for all! It covers your every sin. Past sin, present sin and future sin. Your secret sins and your public sins. The sins you are not aware of and the sins that keep you awake at night. When Jesus cried from the cross 'It is finished' that is what he meant. He saves sufficiently.

<u>Think about:</u> Because Jesus saves us completely, we are guaranteed that we too will live forever as Kings in his Kingdom and as Priests in his presence!
