Losing Joy

Over desires

Contrast the person described in 5v19 and the person described in 6v2. They both have wealth and possessions, but what is the difference?

Why does the person in 6v2 have no joy? They have no joy from God, because they are focused on what 'their h_____.'

Life, pleasure, wisdom, work and wealth are all good gifts from God. But when we make them our ultimate source of Joy we will become confused, disappointed and frustrated because they do not last.

Empty life

The person who seeks their joy and happiness in wealth and possessions have no rest. What are they concerned about? Look back at chapter 5 verse 12, 14,15

Augustine was an influential Bishop in North Africa about the same time as Patrick came to be a missionary in Ireland. Where did he look for joy?

'My sin was that I sought not in God himself, but in the t_____ he had c_____...and in this way I collapsed into sufferings, embarrassments, and erring of ways.'

Where did he find true joy? 'For there is a joy that is not given to those who do not love you, but only to those who I______ you for your own sake.'

Joy is found in God and we lose that joy when we over desire his gifts.

If God is not our highest pursuit, our greatest desire – our life will be eternally empty.

Keeping Joy

Controlled desires

Verse 7 tells us we have an 'appetite that is never satisfied'.

What are some of the things you want that you think will give you joy?

Augustine had a very close friend who died. His friend's death made him very depressed. This is what he learned: When we seek joy in things and people we are 'chained to things bound to die'...and when we lose them 'we are torn to shreds.' Talk about what this means.

Desire Christ

The things around us, our loved ones, our most treasured possessions are all shadows. They are not the substance. How do we receive and experience eternal Joy?

God's gift of Joy is seen at the death and resurrection of Jesus. What happens through his death and resurrection? Through his death he takes my judgement for loving the g more than the g
Through his resurrection he defeats death and gives us I in all its f
Christ comes to die for us so that we might know him. Christ rises again for us so that we might never lose him.

To Think about: Redirect your love toward God by loving him with your whole heart and loving him for himself,

not just for what he can give you. Then, and only then, does the contentment start to come.
