Utterly powerless v21-22 The p of the law is not to give us a way of being saved. It's there to show us we don't have the p to keep the law.
The more laws I add only revels how powerless I am to <i>Love God.</i> They show me how I should behave but they can't make me do it.
Desperately needy v23-24 You see the law shows us we are s and p so that we would see how desperately we need a s
The law was like a prison warden reminding us ever day how we have failed, and how we keep on failing and will never be released. The law is like a strict school master telling us what do and punishing us when we don't do it.
